The Café will be CLOSED the first week of school (18th September) because it is being refurbished. The good news is that from the following week there will be two new outlets providing refreshments in the café area:


Costa coffee: open 8.30am – 6pm

Advanced piano workshop with Carlina Carr: 2.00pm-5.00pm

pianists from grade 7 upwards through diploma standard.
